Dear Friends,

I was recently asked by a seminary friend of mine to knit a colorful rainbow scarf and hat set for her church to raffle off during the Lansing Michigan Pride Festival. Their congregation has a table at this yearly event and she was looking for a good fundraising possibility. Having seen my interest in knitting and crocheting first hand as my roommate during our three years of school she knew this would be something I'd be happy to take on. And I also probably owed her one as she was always a generous volunteer to ball and often untangle my yarn stash ☺ I set to work immediately.

After scouring knitting patterns and yarn shops to find just the right design and colors for this new project and after a few false starts with patterns that just "weren't quite right," I finally found the correct needle size, material and design and settled in to work. Whenever a free hour arrives in my schedule I excitedly open up my Debbie Urgess original bag purchased from the Christmas Cupboard where my project fits so well, and begin knitting. This calm and ease comes over me as the needles click together, a sense of purpose and also release, as in that moment there's nothing else I need accomplish, plan for, or decide, just knit.

I imagine other knitters or hand crafters may be able to relate to this sensation. I used to call it "Crochet Meditation," although of course you

can fit in any style of craft, crocheting was how I began. I learned in my first year of college from a friend in my dorm and I often joke that it was the most useful thing I learned in college. But when you sit down to create something, especially after all the decision making has been done of what tools, materials and design to use, the process becomes somewhat effortless, and it keeps my hands just busy enough to calm my mind and let it take a break.

I've known the joy of this sensation for some time and enjoyed hand crafts for just this reason. And there was something really different and special about this project. I have been more excited about working on this scarf than any project I've done for a very long time.

I've made baby sweaters for newborns, bags and hats for family Christmas presents. In my 20's I made afghans for just about everyone in my life. These were all fun to do. But what I have to say made this current project so different was simply that someone asked me to do it. I know that it's needed. I'm able to use my love of knitting to do something I know will be useful.

This definite knowledge that my efforts will be useful to others is really quite rare and special. Especially I'd say when it comes to knitting. When I make gifts for others I try to think hard about what they like, their style, or favorite colors but it's always hard to tell if what you

Baked Fish

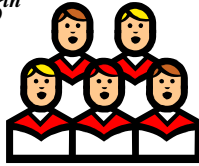
