From the Minister

Dear readers, Advent is almost upon us! The decorating has started at the parsonage; a beautiful wreath is already hanging outside (thank you Women's Alliance!). Now if only I could get rid of those pumpkins....

While I can't wait to add the tree and lights, one of my very favorite decorations is the Nativity. Each year, my husband's parents give us a new piece for our nativity set, and fortunately, our set is a rather sturdy one so we can keep it in reach of the children. We thought it would be a good way for them to begin to learn what Christmas is about. Since the figures are within reach of their hands and imagination, we often notice them on the move once they come out of the box. They've been on parade and they've been scattered. And then we'll find ourselves surprised to see that they have all made their way back to that most precious moment and place, huddling close together, each wanting to adore Baby Jesus.

Thinking on this moment, and this scene to come – with the figures of the wise men and the shepherds standing shoulder to shoulder – I'm struck once more by the vastly different routes they took in real life to arrive at this sacred destination. Scripture tells us that while both felt the call to find the newborn Savior, the

shepherds had a significantly easier route – they were in the fields nearby when the angel appeared with the news. How they must have felt when "a great company of the heavenly host appeared with the angel, praising God…" (Luke 2:13). Do you think they ever looked up at the night sky again, without remembering such a vision or the voices that shared a message that must have made their hearts stand still? They hurry off to find this newborn Savior, and they are changed forever.

The wise men, on the other hand, have quite a different journey in front of them. They see the star in the east and begin to follow it, but get lost along the way. They have to search out the wisdom of the past to find their way in the present; and how odd that they turn to the one who wanted to harm Jesus, to help them find their way. But their persistence is richly rewarded, and eventually, perhaps many months after Jesus is born, they do arrive to worship the Child, and to offer their gifts.

We too, find ourselves on this great and wonderful journey to know God as best we can, and to develop this relationship. We want the love and wisdom of the Lord to be born in our hearts and minds in newer and deeper ways. We use the Lord's teachings like the guiding star, to bring us to this destination, and to

I'm in no doubt that there must be countless paths to the Divine...and no matter the route, I love that both the shepherds and the Magi were able to make it to Jesus' side because that was their heart's desire. If it is our desire too, I hope that this Christmas season, we find ourselves having moved a little closer to the Divine.
