Greetings, dear readers! I hope you have had a good summer!

On our family's list of things to do this summer was to read. The children enrolled in the local library's summer reading program – their job was to read about heroes!



On August 25th, I took the children to the end of the summer reading celebration. They spent two hours with other children and librarian Donnette Barnes and Jenny Huang-Dale making their own mask and cape, coloring and eating snacks. This meant I had *two whole hours!* to browse the shelves and read. I wasn't sure what to settle on until I spied a book I had heard of often but had never read – *Proof of Heaven: A Neurosurgeon's Journey into the Afterlife.* If you've already read it, I hope you won't mind being reminded of its beauty and the peace it offers.

The author, Eben Alexander, is the neurosurgeon who experienced a life-threatening, rare illness (*E.coli* bacterial meningitis) that attacked his brain; the part of his brain that controls human emotion and thought shut down completely. For seven days, he lay in a deep coma. While his family and doctors were losing hope of any recovery, Eben was experiencing the afterlife.

In his book, he attempts to describe three different kinds of places he visited (many times he references how limiting our earthly language is). He first found himself in a dark, muddy place that he calls Earthworm's Eye View; the second place he calls the Gateway, a more beautiful world than words can describe. There in the Gateway, he sees countryside, children laughing and playing, people singing and dancing, music that his whole body hears – all of this he sees and feels from the wing of a butterfly flying overhead. All of it so much more real than anything he had experienced on earth. And the girl who flew beside him shared these three messages with him:

"You are loved and cherished, dearly, forever."
"You have nothing to fear."
"There is nothing you can do wrong."

The kind of unconditional love Eben felt is what he wishes we could all know – this was no dream.

The third place he experiences he calls the Core. At first he finds himself in the clouds, but then moves toward a completely dark immense void that is infinitely comforting. Pitch black yet brimming with light; something about the experience strikes him as a fetus in the womb – in this case, the mother is our Creator God, whom he begins to call "Om." When questions come to his mind, he finds he perceives answers immediately.

"...this Being was warm and...personal. It understood humans, and it possessed the qualities we possess, only in infinitely greater measure. It knew me deeply... Om told me that there is not one universe but many – in fact, more than I could conceive – but that love lay at the center of them all."

I cannot do justice to the book here, but let me share one more excerpt:

"Our truest deepest self is completely free. It is not crippled or compromised by past actions or concerned with identity or status. It comprehends that it has no need to fear the earthly world, and therefore, it has no need to build itself up through fame or wealth or conquest.

This is the true spiritual self that all of us are destined someday to recover. But until that day comes, I feel, we should do everything in our power to get in touch with this miraculous aspect of ourselves – to cultivate it and bring it to light. This is the being living within all of us right now, and that is in fact, the being that God truly intends us to be.

How do we get closer to this genuine spiritual self? By manifesting love and compassion. Why? Because love and compassion are far more than the abstractions many of us believe them to be. They are real, they are concrete. And they make up the very fabric of the spiritual realm. In order to return to that realm, we must once again become like that realm, even while we are stuck in, and plodding through, this one."

This book would have been on my book list - the hero in this story is God, "Om" - who has created us with such love, beauty and joy. May we manifest love and compassion, and so feel more closely united and "at home."




From the Swedenborg Foundation summer newsletter:
