Dear Friends,

**The Maine Council Of Churches' Mission:**  
*To inspire congregations and persons of faith to unite in good works that build a culture of justice, compassion and peace rooted in the Hebrew and Christian Scriptures.*

As you may know, the Maine Association of the Church of the New Jerusalem, which includes The Portland New Church, the Fryeburg New Church, The Fryeburg New Church Assembly and various individual members at large, is now an active member of the Maine Council of Churches. I was elected at our last Annual meeting to serve as the representative of the New Church and sit on the MCC Board of Directors which meets monthly. This organization has been in existence since 1938. An interesting historical fact that we should not forget is that the Rev. Louis Dole (father of Rev. Dr. George Dole who was born in the Fryeburg parsonage and is now serving the Bath Church), who served as minister at both the Fryeburg New Church and the Bath New Church, was one of the Maine Council of Church's founding members! Since it's beginning, this organization has joined people from a wide variety of Christian denominations to work together for the common good. From the beginning its members have set aside theological differences and focused on

what we hold in common. And it has also from the beginning maintained a position of neutrality in regard to political parties, while vigorously engaging issues of social and economic justice bringing to bear the perspective of the Lord's call to "love thy neighbor as thy self" found in the parable of the Good Samaritan and the parable of the Lord's Judgment found in Matthew 25:31-46.

Currently there are a number of major concerns for the MCC. They include, but are not limited to, social and economic equality for the four Native American tribes here in Maine who, in spite of their legal victory in gaining "ownership" of a large amount of the land that was taken from them by the European "invaders" still suffer from poverty, discrimination and an oppressive lack of educational and employment opportunities. This, by the way, is not an issue specific to Maine. It is one of America's secret shames that many of the Native Tribes throughout the country live in some of the very worst poverty ridden, ghetto-like conditions to be found anywhere. While Black and Hispanic cultures have made real progress in finding equality and some modicum of redress and acceptance in white culture, the Native Americans remain our ignored and forgotten minority.

Another area of concern the MCC has worked on in the recent past is what is called "Restorative Justice," i.e. working to help those incarcerated in our legal system find ways to achieve rehabilitation and education and freedom of religion within the system so that they may emerge not as hardened criminals who are an even worse danger to society and bent on a life-style guaranteed to return them to prison, but as people making a new start bent on a life-style of meaningful employment, committed faith and new social skills and prepared for a life-style that is not only compatible with, but a positive contribution to, society.

Also among the top issues of concern is educating and motivating people of faith to do some serious self-reflection and make life-style changes that positively reflect our Biblically based charge to be stewards of the earth. This involves the obvious things like recycling and conserving energy, but it also extends to our habits as consumers. The MCC is actively seeking to educate and encourage people to buy locally, to support products that involve the least amount of unnecessary chemicals, shipping and packaging, and to patronize companies and products that are committed to responsible use and care for resources and their employees. For example buying beef from local farmers instead of that which is grown in South America (i.e. almost all fast food chains), not only slows down the demand for grazing land which is the primary cause for the alarmingly rapid destruction of Rain Forest, it also eliminates the need to consume the great quantities of oil required to ship the product by boat and truck and the resulting pollution of their exhaust. More importantly, it also supports the local economy and the small business owners and laborers who are your neighbors. Ironically, it may cost a little more to buy local produce because most of the time local farmers are small scale compared to the mega-companies that dominate the market. But the positive contribution to the environment, the local economy and one's own health and spiritual well-being are well worth the small extra expense. Buying locally also helps ensure a food distribution system that is not dependant on large scale transportation and is therefore less vulnerable to disruption at a national level.

Other issues the MCC is involved in include the National Religious Campaign Against Torture and a coalition for humane

comprehensive immigration reform. There is much more which I hope to share with you in the coming months, but for now I encourage us all to do some serious self-reflection, repentance and reformation, which is the very process of spiritual regeneration, particularly around our personal life-styles and practices as consumers. We Swedenborgians understand that as spiritual beings living in a material realm, spirituality is not separate from life in the world. Rather our outward actions in the world are the expression of our faith and the confirmation of our inner spiritual relationship with the Lord. Keep the Greatest Commandment before you in all things: "Thou shalt love the Lord thy God with all thy heart, and with all thy soul, and with all thy mind. This is the first and great commandment. And the second is like unto it, thou shalt love thy neighbor as thy self."

Our deepest condolences are with her family.


## Choir



*Making the Connection III: Toxics and Tomorrows' Children*

**March 14, 2008, 8:30am-4:00pm**

Abromson Center at the University of Southern Maine, Portland

Young children and developing babies in the womb are uniquely vulnerable to toxic chemicals which also threaten wildlife development. Our federal safety system for industrial chemicals is badly broken requiring state leadership in chemical policy reform. Emerging science links chronic disease trends to preventable chemical exposures. The concerns around chemicals in children's products have flooded the news and are moving citizens and groups to unite across the county to ignite

change. This conference will bring together health and scientific experts, policy perspectives and on the ground activists to address the most pressing issues surrounding toxics and children's health.

Keynote speaker Dr. Phil Landrigan, MD, MSc., Director of the Center for Children's Health. In 1997 and 1998, Dr. Landrigan served as Senior Advisor on Children's Health to the Administrator of the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency. He was responsible at EPA for helping to establish a new Office of Children's Health Protection.
